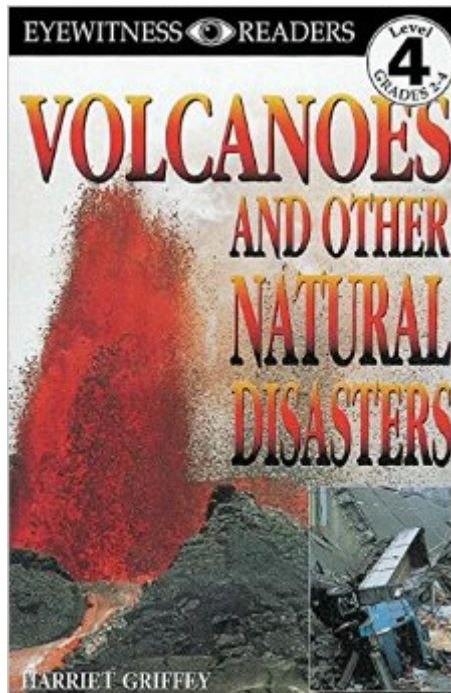

My son and I enjoyed this book, and the reading level was right. But parents with younger or more sensitive kids should know that some of the descriptions in the book are excessively graphic and

even fairly disturbing. They get into the details of how certain events kill people, and I found myself skipping a number of sentences to spare both myself and my son of something we don't really want to be thinking about. Aside from that, the illustrations are generous (and not very upsetting), and the stories are well picked. Note that most of the events are not earthquakes. Events include avalanches, fires and volcanoes as well.

This reader is jam-packed with disaster stories and the science and geography that caused the event. My children love real stories above those that are made up. More school subjects are covered and History has become a bit more interesting. What more can I say but WOW!
